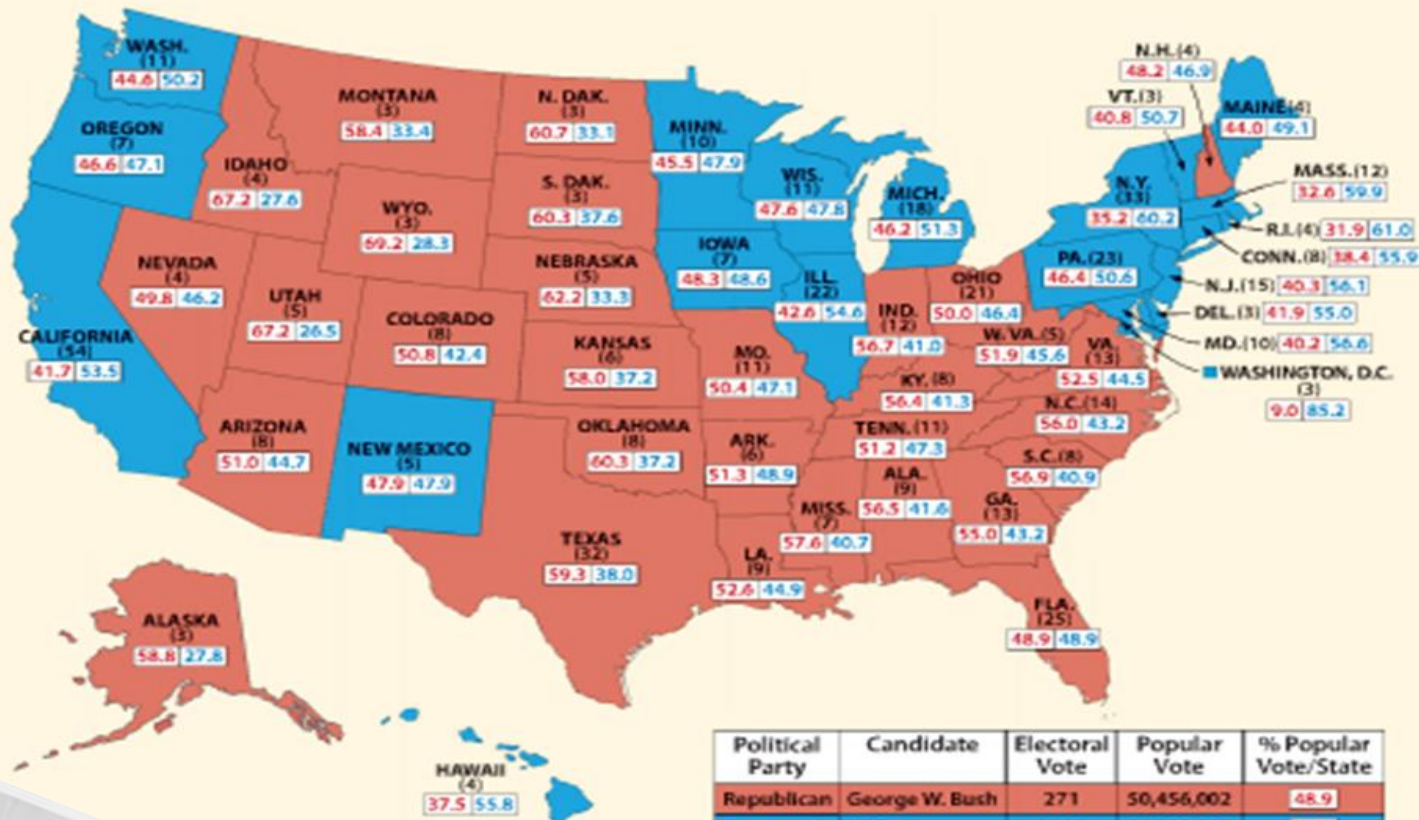


# Election Results

- It was the longest and most expensive campaign in the history of the nation up to that time. How did it turn out? In a dead heat. It took 36 days to find out who had won.

Political Party	Candidate	Electoral Vote	Popular Vote	% Popular Vote/State
Republican	George W. Bush	271	50,456,002	48.9
Democrat	Al Gore	266	50,999,897	48.9

The US presidential election remains undecided as "final" tallies are reported. Vice President Al Gore (D-TN) has a slim popular vote lead, with 48,976,148 votes to contender George W. Bush (R-TX)'s 48,783,510 votes, for a popular-vote margin of 192,638. Gore has won 18 states plus the District of Columbia for 260 electoral votes; Bush has 29 states with 246 electoral votes. Florida's 25 undecided electoral votes will give either candidate enough to surpass the 270 electoral votes needed to claim the presidency.

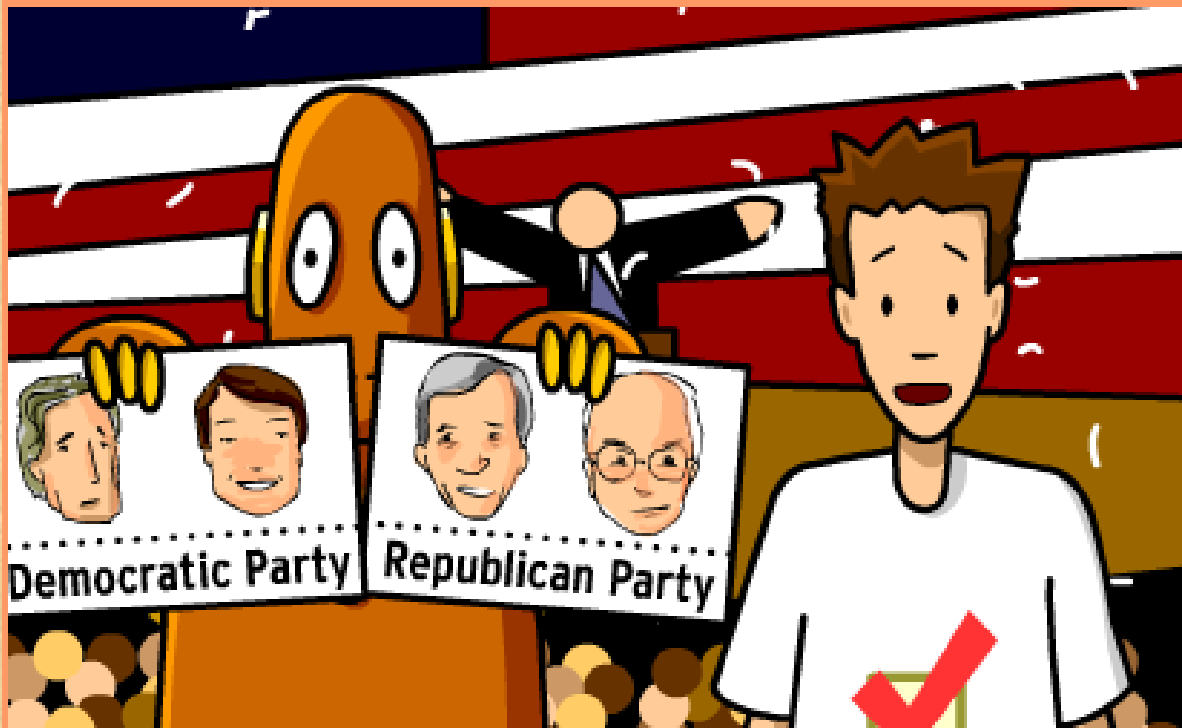

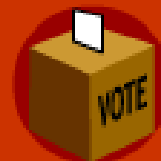

# The 21<sup>st</sup> Century



- When the 21st century emerged, Americans were optimistic, energetic, more free than any people anywhere, and dedicated to that freedom. We were enjoying a breezy, confident, promising time of affluence and achievement. After a long and tortuous Cold War, it seemed to the average American as if the world's problems were on the way to being solved and that democracy would soon be universal. How could there be a contest? How could oppression triumph over freedom?
- Most of us were very sure of ourselves, but we were underestimating the power of demons: of anger, jealousy, poverty, and ignorance. We were the world's superpower, and often so self-absorbed that we hardly paid attention to what was going on in the rest of the world (aside from wanting global customers). We knew that a worldwide terrorist network, al-Qaeda (pronounced "al-kay-duh"), was training a generation of young men in tactics of violence, but we didn't do much about it. We'd forgotten that freedom is a delicate flower that needs nurturing or rough feet will trample it.
